

Where children learn, grow, and thrive



As childcare and early learning needs grew, Luthercare expanded its mission in the 1990s to respond to this need. We currently operate three Luthercare for Kids Early Learning Centers in Annville, Marietta, and Reamstown.

For many families, quality childcare is unaffordable and often hard to find. Access to quality childcare is important for everyone, but especially important for children in families living near or below the federal poverty threshold who often face barriers to success from the day they are born. Without auality care, children aren't properly prepared to enter Kindergarten, and they can spend most of their time in school playing "catch-up."

The Annville center, Luthercare's first, was founded in 1991 and moved to its current location in 1996. The center provides children with an academically strong and nurturing environment. Our dedicated team members make sure that the children in their care begin their lives on a firm foundation and are prepared for Kindergarten. These earliest years can change the trajectories of their lives.

Ashley Kozak, a mother of four children currently enrolled at Annville, says her children greatly benefited from the quality care and are prepared for kindergarten. "My children are happy, and they love coming here. My children are welcomed every day," says Ashley. Her youngest child displayed some behavior challenges over the last two years, but Ashley feels that our teachers, Miss Ashley and Miss Tia, put in the effort to patiently work with him, and they never gave up. Miss Ashley created visuals, and Miss Tia put a plan into action that reinforced his positive behaviors. Now, Ashley's youngest son is thriving, thanks to the team effort by the Annville center's dedicated teachers.





IRA Charitable Contribution

If you are 72 or older and hold an Individual Retirement Account (IRA), you must take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) each year even if you don't need the resources. The RMD from your IRA increases your total taxable income and could potentially push you into a higher income tax bracket. Using your IRA to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) directly to Luthercare reduces your taxable income and can help you lower your tax bill and prevent you from entering a higher income tax bracket. Because of these benefits, many donors are choosing to make QCDs from their IRAs.

It may be a suitable giving strategy for some donors:

- You must be 72 or older to be eligible to make a QCD.
- These gifts count toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).
- QCDs are limited to the amount that would otherwise be taxed as ordinary income. This excludes nondeductible contributions.
- The maximum annual amount that can qualify for a QCD is \$100,000. This applies to the sum of QCDs made to one or more charities in a calendar year. (If, however, you file taxes jointly, your spouse can also make a QCD from his or her own IRA within the same tax year for up to \$100,000.) The funds must come out of your IRA by your RMD deadline, generally December 31.

Last year, the RMD age increased to 72 as a result of the "Setting Every Community Up for Security Enhancement (SECURE) Act, and RMDs were waived by the CARES Act. The RMD waiver has not been extended in 2021, and as a result, anyone 72 or older must take their RMD.
