The Luthercare family makes a lasting difference in the lives of residents, children, nurses, and the greater communities in which we serve. I'm blessed to be a part of this family, and I couldn't be prouder of all the work being done with the help of our generous supporters. This year to date, 25 residents have been helped by Luthercare's benevolent care fund. Because of you, these residents and their families were given peace of mind, and now they can continue to receive top-notch care in the place they call home, even without the ability to pay.

You have provided 44 kids with childcare scholarships, so they can continue receiving care at the Luthercare for Kids Early Learning Centers. The scholarship fund exists to help hard-working families in need of a little help. Just a few weeks ago, I heard that a single mom with two young boys was having a hard time affording the cost of care, despite holding down a full-time job. Because of you, we were able to provide her and her boys the support needed to continue receiving care at our center.

You helped 36 high school seniors and potential nurses get a little closer to achieving their goals. Scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 were given to students from Annville-Cleona, Cedar Crest, Cocalico, Conestoga Valley, Donegal, ELCO, Elizabethtown, Ephrata, Garden Spot, Lampeter-Strasburg, Lebanon, Manheim Central, Manheim Township, McCaskey, Palmyra, Penn Manor, and Warwick school districts. Last month, you also helped us award a much-deserved scholarship to a Licensed Practical Nurse at our Spang Crest community, so she can achieve her dream of becoming a Registered Nurse.

Your generosity has allowed Luthercare to accomplish a lot over the course of this past year. As you reflect on 2022, I would like to invite you to remember those we've lost and honor those who've made a profound impact on our lives by making a gift of \$25 or more to sponsor a luminaria that will shine during the ninth annual "Lights of Luthercare" celebration. Systems Aligned in Learning (SAIL) is a program born out of Luthercare's focus on helping the youngest to the oldest in our community. The program focuses on ensuring that Lancaster County's preschool-age children receive the support necessary to transition to Kindergarten, while being prepared and ready to learn.

SAIL is comprised of four community partners: Luthercare (the project's lead agency), the Library System of Lancaster County, Penn Medicine Lancaster General Health (LGH), and COBYS Family Services. These partners work in tandem to close the school-readiness gap that exists between preschool-age children who benefit from high-quality, center-based learning environments and those who are cared for by home-based providers.



During our six years in operation, SAIL's bilingual mentors have worked hand-in-hand with over 65 home-based providers, and we're currently impacting the lives of more than 150 children. We routinely help providers establish lesson plans, connect families to needed community programs, and obtain valued certifications through the PA Department of Human Services (DHS) and the Keystone Stars program. SAIL mentors offer additional support as translators for Spanish-speaking providers during inspections from the DHS.



IRA Charitable Contribution A Tax-Efficient Way to Donate

If you are 72 or older and hold an Individual Retirement Account (IRA), you must take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) each year even if you don't need the resources. The RMD from your IRA increases your total taxable income and could potentially push you into a higher income tax bracket. Using your IRA to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) directly to Luthercare reduces your taxable income and can help you lower your tax bill and prevent you from entering a higher income tax bracket. Because of these benefits, many donors are choosing to make QCDs from their IRAs.





It may be a suitable giving strategy for some donors:

- You must be 701/2 or older to be eligible to make a QCD.
- These gifts count toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).
- QCDs are limited to the amount that would otherwise be taxed as ordinary income. This excludes nondeductible contributions.
- The maximum annual amount that can qualify for a QCD is \$100,000. This applies to the sum of QCDs made to one or more charities in a calendar year. (If, however, you file taxes jointly, your spouse can also make a QCD from his or her own IRA within the same tax year for up to \$100,000.) The funds must come out of your IRA by your RMD deadline, generally December 31.
